Scientific investigators are working to answer fundamental questions about the pathophysiology of type 1 diabetes.

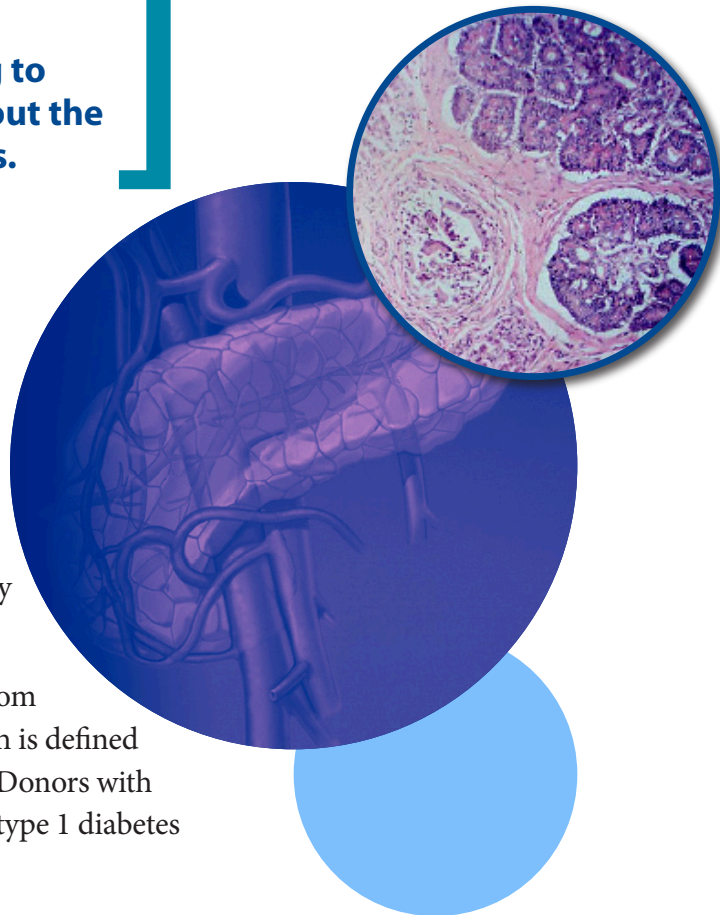
The following donor types are in need:

- Donors with type 1 and type II diabetes
- Donors with diabetic ketoacidosis (DKA)
- Pediatric donors
- Pregnant women

NDRI seeks to recover pancreata and related tissues (spleen, lymph nodes, pancreatic lymph nodes, peripheral blood) from a variety of donor types.

Researchers are interested in studying tissue from donors with recent onset type 1 diabetes, which is defined as the period up to 24 months after diagnosis. Donors with diabetic ketoacidosis (DKA) but no history of type 1 diabetes are also of significant interest.

Type 1 diabetes investigators believe that these tissues will help them answer some of the fundamental questions about the early pathophysiology of type 1 diabetes, and allow them to address questions related to preventing and permanently reversing the disease.
